3361 APOLOGIES

Apologies were noted from Cllr Bridges and from Inspector Andy Fee (Sergeant Leighton Williams attended in his absence).

3362 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

a) **RESOLVED to approve as a correct record the Minutes of the Annual Council meeting held on 19th May 2020, copies of which had previously been circulated with the Agenda.**

Cllr Kirk asked whether minutes will show receipt of a revised application regarding the residents' issue in Springfield Park? Town Clerk confirmed this is correct.

Cllr Palmen stated there is an update on the licensing application on Wicker Hill, requesting opening until 1.30am at the weekends. We continue to object to this. Cllr Palmen has offered to sit on the licensing committee for this.

d) **Policy & Resources Committee meeting delegated on 7th July.**

Cllr Piazza asked about the decision made concerning the North Bradley boundary changes. It was in the press and he considers the residents were not fully aware of the proposal so he has invited some residents to ask questions on this topic. The Mayor stated this is a resolution of P&R committee so it cannot be changed tonight. Unless the committee want to take this back it cannot be changed. Cllr Palmen stated that he does not favour it to go back to committee as it was a 9-1 vote. Cllr Fuller stated the public can speak in the public forum if desired but no change to the decision can be made. The Town Clerk stated if a certain number of the P&R committee members want to take this back to committee then it would be possible but it is a proposal by Wiltshire Council so they would need to be contacted.

3365 COMMUNICATIONS BY THE MAYOR

The Mayor, Cllr Fuller, gave the following statements;

Members have already received the sad news of the passing of Bob Conway. You will recall his annual attendance at the War Memorial where he laid a wreath on behalf of the Normandy Veterans of whom he was one. Despite an increase in age and disability he continued to do so and we all saw him lay his wreath with great difficulty last November. I would ask you now to join me in a few moments of silence to honour the memory of his example for us all.

A letter was received from the Lord-Lieutenant of Wiltshire to say, "Thank the Town Council for all you are doing for the community during the Covid-19 pandemic. We have lived through an extraordinary period over the last few months. At times it has been frustrating and difficult and there have been some tragic stories concerning health, livelihoods and employment. Just perhaps, however, it has been a chance to re-evaluate and re-calibrate our lives, to keep an eye out for others, to slow down a bit, and appreciate families and friends even more. Many people in the county have been involved in countless inspirational and important projects that have made a real difference to peoples' lives. The Government is suggesting that individuals can nominate another individual's name for a special Covid-19 Honour. All details of the simple form are on the Government website at: GOV.UK Honour for Coronavirus work. It will be given to some of those who have done particularly important voluntary work during the pandemic."

It is with regret that I have to advise that I have received a number of complaints from an individual in respect of 'council administration and procedures and how the Town Clerk has dealt with these concerns'. These details have been forwarded to me under the provisions of Clause 7 of the Complaints Procedure. This issue will be passed to the Town Clerk's Review Panel for detailed consideration. I have acknowledged receipt of the complaint and advised the complainant that consideration should take place after lockdown, when we have returned to the Civic Centre for our meetings. The complainant will be invited to attend and address the meeting.

3366 PUBLIC OPEN FORUM

Questions from the public were received as follows:

Mr Willsmer, North Bradley Parish Cllr, stated he is very disappointed to hear the earlier comments regarding the boundary review. He doesn't believe Wiltshire Council has forced TTC into this decision. Any development on either of the sites is unlikely to happen in the next 2 years, if at all. He would like this decision to be delayed for 2 years to the next CGR. North Bradley is a historic village and TTC should not feel comfortable with taking 25% of the land. Cllr Fuller responded that we are just the consultee and you should approach North Bradley Parish Council or Wiltshire Council. He stated he has already done this but hasn't received an acceptable response. Cllr Fuller welcomed his views and clarified that this will go to Wiltshire Council in September and that TTC will not really influence the final decision.

Mr Jubbie stated that at last Council meeting he raised 3 questions regarding FOI, Park Governance and Data Breaches to which he hasn't received written answers. He asked when he will receive these answers? The Town Clerk believes these were sent after the last meeting but he will check this.

Mr Jubbie asked the council to define consultation? He is concerned that money has already been spent on land and planning permission for Doric Park without consultation with the public. Cllr Fuller answered that consultation is talking to his electorate. The council is a public body but when it comes to Doric Park further consultation will take place and there is a mention of consultation on the relevant agenda item later in this meeting. Mr Jubbie understands that government guidelines state that putting items on a public agenda is not adequate consultation. If the public were to object now it would be too late to make changes. The only people that have responded to the planning permission so far are residents of Hilperton, not Trowbridge. Cllr Fuller stated that it would depend on the extent and strength of any objections. Cllr Brice highlighted this has been in the press regularly in recent years.

Mr Jubbie responded that this is only information giving, not consultation as it is not asking for public opinion by providing a name and address to write to. It is telling the public what you are doing. Cllr Fuller stated that further consultation will take place at a later date.

Mr Mellilo stated that the North Bradley boundary review change is a premature decision as there is no guarantee of development on Elm Groves. He believes that TTC can be influential on the land at North Bradley and it is a sly way of gaining land. My family have been North Bradley residents for 40 years and have not been consulted on this matter. Cllr Fuller stated that as Mr Mellilo doesn't live in Trowbridge we wouldn't normally communicate with you but later on in the agenda it states that a letter will be issued to residents on Drynham Lane. It wouldn't normally be expected that members of TTC would consult with another parish. Mr Mellilo disagrees and believes that they should have been consulted and it is being done coercively. Cllr Fuller said TTC don't make the decisions but he feels for the people of North Bradley if they end up as Trowbridge. If all the houses do get built around you then it won't continue to be the same North Bradley. There may be other areas that might come into the Trowbridge boundary and it could change the character of North Bradley. Mr Mellilo states that TTC were consulted and you could have said you are against the decision and respect the opinions of the North Bradley residents and their boundaries. Cllr Palmen agrees that this is going further than we wanted but we would rather not threaten the increase we have been offered. Mr Mellilo stated his frustration with the decision and is none the wiser why TTC haven't objected against the proposal.

3367 **POLICE MATTERS**

A Police Report was received from Sergeant Leighton Williams.

Following the opening of Public Houses on 5/6th July and 11th/12th July most people in Trowbridge were very well behaved and as per licensing conditions practices had been put in place. Anti-social behaviour by juveniles has occurred at Southwick Country Park. Patrols have been put in place and the ability to disperse youths is now allowed by implementation of a dispersal power. Residents of Regal Court have recently highlighted anti-social driving behaviour in the car park opposite County Hall. We have heightened patrols in order to deal with some of these offences. Speed awareness is the biggest problem since lockdown but community speed watch is in now in place allowing the police to work with community teams. 1st priority is to tackle organised crime such as County Lines. PC Brand is going some great work in the area. Sergeant Williams invited questions. Cllr King has set up a community speed watch group in Cockhill but it has halted due to lockdown. Sergeant Williams agreed training has been difficult due to social distancing. Cllr King stated we are waiting for a SID to be delivered courtesy of the Town Clerk. Cllr Palmen acknowledged the excellent police report and the good work being done by the police. He asked about the works vans getting equipment stolen and asked what work is being done to resolve this? Sergeant Williams agreed there has been a spike in these offences in recent weeks and it has gone to the Community Tasking Team, supported by the police on neighbourhoods. We believe they are organised gangs coming across county borders and we have a specific vehicle being used by those offenders being watched. Teams on nights are on foot patrol, the public are aware of it and it has been highlighted on social media. Unfortunately, power tools are not suitable for forensic analysis and we don't often get serial numbers so returning the stolen goods are not easily returned. CCTV is not always helpful if people are covered in hoods etc. We are hoping to start using Automatic Number Plate Recognition. Cllr Brice thanked Helen and her team for their work on anti-social behaviour at the College Recreation Ground. Cllr Fuller asked about the man found at Biss Meadows. Sergeant Williams confirmed that sadly the man was identified and we are supporting the family. Cllr Fuller thanked for Sergeant Williams' attendance.

3368 **ENVIRONMENTAL WORKING GROUP – ECOLOGICAL EMERGENCY**

The Council considered the recommendation of the group.

Cllr Hoar expressed his thanks to the Trowbridge community and to councillors from all groups. Cllr Kirk asked if there is a huge cost implication. Cllr Hoar responded that the costing implications need to be factored in. It will be integral into all decisions going forward. Cllr Kirk highlighted the difficulties with moving to a renewable energy supplier. Cllr Cavill stated that these processes must be managed with effective and reasonable expenditure therefore it is not a blank cheque. Cllr Hoar stated that it needs to be an integral part of the council but it is difficult to put a cost to it now. Cllr Fuller stated that it will be for P&R if they want to alter the budget at all. Cllr Piazza was supportive of this motion and sent a BBC article to Cllrs Hoar and Palmen about Holland which looked beautiful for the town and saved lots of money on grass cutting.

3369 PUBLICATION OF NOTES OF BOARDS, PANELS & WORKING GROUPS

The report and recommendation were considered and the recommendation was proposed and seconded:

Cllr Piazza stated that notes of the working groups are captured and you can't stop a FOI request if notes are held. Cllr King highlighted that there are many things to be considered and it is an evidence gathering group. Cllr Piazza stated that the only way round it is to do this verbally. Cllr Bryant stated it would be totally impossible to remember all the discussions without writing anything down. Cllr King stated that we can't behave differently in meetings due to FOI. Cllr Kirk suggested that the working party notes should go on the website to be open to the public. Cllr Bryant highlighted that there should be an opportunity for Cllrs to discuss sensitive information without publishing it, followed by consultation. Cllr Fuller asked if the Town Clerk believes we will be safe under FOI with the recommendation. Town Clerk clarified you can't stop the FOIs but most will recognise that it is a working party it is not something the council have already made a decision on. Cllr Brice agreed with the Town Clerk. Cllr Piazza requested the word 'not' is removed from statement b. The Town Clerk advised this would not be admissible as an amendment as it is a negating amendment but it could be voted in 2 separate votes if Councillors prefer. The Council

3370 BOUNDARY REVIEW & COUNCIL TAX

The report and recommendation were considered, it was proposed and seconded

When the previous CGR was conducted by Wiltshire Council the Town Council wrote to all households (copy of a typical letter is attached). This included, for example, the houses in Paxcroft Mead which transferred from Hilperton and the houses on Drynham Lane which were not transferred. Included in the letter was information about the change in Council Tax. In North Bradley there are up to 13 households in the proposed Drynham Ward and up to 4 in the proposed Park Ward.

The Town Clerk read the letter which he had personally delivered in 2015 to residents of Drynham Lane. Cllr Kirk thanked the Town Clerk for including part of his motion in his recommendation but believes it is still not transparent that residents will be responsible for repayment of loans. Individual rates would be £164.98 for Trowbridge compared with £22.03 for North Bradley. He feels we are being misleading as we put our submission to CGR in 2016. He explained that we are trying to expand the town and local residents are sharing the cost. He concurs with what was said earlier and hopes this can be deferred. Cllr Palmen supports the motion and the letter, believing residents generally look at the whole council tax figure. Cllr Bryant states that Cllr Kirk mentioned TTC taking Paxcroft Mead but we only took a small part. Cllr Brice mentioned that this is government policy and is decided by Wiltshire Council, not Trowbridge Town Council. Cllr Piazza asked if the letter says who to contact? Town Clerk states that Wiltshire Council details will be added to the letter. Cllr Kirk wants to amend the motion stating the Town Council Precept amount. **The amendment was accepted by the proposer and seconder:** The Council:

3371 **TOILETS WORKING GROUP**

RESOLVED to note:

The notes of the meeting which were released to a member of the public have been interpreted and published as though decisions have already been made. No conclusions have been reached and everything is a work in progress, before the Working Group reaches a conclusion and officially reports to the committee with recommendations it is likely to change the options under consideration and the analysis of each option, so no options have been discounted and the Working Group may consider reconstruction of toilets in the previous location.

Cllr Kirk noticed that the working group notes don't state the original location of the toilets. Cllr Bryant clarified this would be a new build. Cllr Fuller thanked the working group for what they are doing.

3373 **BORROWING APPROVAL – DORIC PARK PROJECT**

The council considered funding for the Doric Park 3G-ATP Project and submission of a borrowing approval application.

Cllr Kirk asked the contribution that Hilperton Parish Council are making to the project? Also, could the Town Clerk confirm that a legal right of access has been agreed with Trowbridge Rugby Club? Town Clerk stated that Hilperton Parish Council hasn't been asked to contribute and they haven't proactively offered to. The right of access hasn't been signed off but they will be holding their delayed annual meeting shortly with a recommendation to approve. Cllr Kirk is concerned that it is a potential ransom strip. Town Clerk answered that no it is not as we have access off the main road. Cllr Kirk states this is not a business plan, just a single forecast and it hinges on a single client meaning day to day occupancy will be difficult to replicate. Cllr Kirk believes that the middle slots in the day are the hardest to fill and there is no commitment after 2 years. Town Clerk stated that the 2 other facilities at Calne and Chippenham have secured daytime use over a number of years and that the business plan is in two parts, the confidential figures and a written report. Cllr Kirk would like more detail and would recommend deferral until more information is available. Cllr Palmen states Radstock has a pitch and we are continuing to build this business model. Cllr Piazza is concerned about this business plan and would like to make an amendment that this comes back to Full Council, not P&R. Cllr Oldrieve stated that we have previously required good quality outdoor pitches and we now need to clarify if we are prepared for the Town Clerk to take out loans for this project.

Cllr Kirk would like more information and in light of the application regarding the storage unit, please could Town Clerk circulate to Cllrs the requirement for loans. Town Clerk stated that the Wiltshire Association of Local Councils are not required to check the form, just that it has been completed before it goes to the Ministry. Cllr Piazza asked how long you would want to defer this? Cllr Kirk withdrew this as he is satisfied provided there is disclosure to the public regarding the loan.

RESOLVED: That; subject to confirmation of tenders, planning approval and public consultation; the Town Council submits a borrowing approval application to MHCLG for up to £2.2million for the Doric Park 3G – Artificial Turf Pitch Project.

And That the Council notes the following:

Based on the latest information from HM Treasury this equates to an annual repayment, including interest of £104,398.74 over a 30-year term at an interest rate of 2.48%. This equates to a total of £3,131,962.20 including interest and repayments.

And, the borrowing application, if approved, would not be taken until the financial situation of the town council resulting from the impact of the pandemic and the future financial security of the council is understood. And that a final decision on progressing the project would be subject to the decision of Full Council.
