3377 APOLOGIES

RESOLVED to approve apologies from Cllr Blakemore, Cllr Bridges, Cllr Halik and Cllr Whiffen.

3378 MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

a) **RESOLVED** to approve as a correct record the Minutes of the Annual Council meeting held on 21st July 2020, copies of which had previously been circulated with the Agenda.

b) No questions were considered.

3379 MINUTES OF COMMITTEES

RESOLVED to approve the following reports, minutes and recommendations of Committees already circulated:

a) **Town Development Committee** meeting, on 4th August & 8th September.

b) **Policy & Resources Committee** meeting, on 1st September.

3380 DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

a) There were no declarations of interest.

b) There were no Dispensation Requests received by the Town Clerk and not previously considered.

3381 COMMUNICATIONS BY THE MAYOR

The Mayor reported on his attendance at the following events;

- 3 Citizenship ceremonies.
- A 100th Birthday.
- Opening of the park storage unit. Cllrs Bryant and King commented that the park storage unit and landscaping has been done extremely well.

14th March 2021 has been confirmed as the Civic Service and Remembrance Sunday will be going ahead with limited numbers on 8th November.

The Mayor stated that the Councillors which were members of the Independent Conservative Group have now changed to be Independents due to dispute with the Conservative Party. J. Weimar will check and confirm group numbers and The Town Clerk will look at this in terms of committee allocation.

3382 PUBLIC OPEN FORUM

Questions from the public were received as follows:

a) Mrs Hillcoat gave a statement; *"I have asked Cllr Bazan to bring a motion forward to this council so that you can formulate an objection to the application by NREL Hills Waste to build an energy from waste plant, ie. An incinerator, in Westbury. The impact of bringing an incinerator to the area is too large to ignore. Since 2015 NREL Hills waste have applied for 4 applications for building a plant in the town. Think fuel, think grate, think toxic ash. In 2018 an application was rejected based on its visual impact. In 2020 the company have applied to build an incinerator 30% bigger in size, working 24 hours a day. The impact of bringing more than 233,000 tonnes of industrial waste from at least 2 hours away is huge. With this increase in HGV movement and the associated air pollution are the effects of the plume*

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from the chimney. Westbury has higher mortality rates from lung disease, heart conditions and cancer due to large scale industrial plants near domestic housing. Like Trowbridge the town has seen a growth in housing since 2015, with more than 400 houses in close proximity to the proposed incinerator. Westbury, Frome & BOA councils and 8 parish councils objected to a smaller application for an incinerator and are doing so again. Will Trowbridge Town council object and complete the jigsaw?"

b) Mr Jubbie asked;

Q. Was there a consultation taken by the Toilets Working Party, and will the results be made public? How much was spent on this consultation?

A. The results were put into minutes and Cllr Palmen agreed a summary could be made public. The cost was approximately £25 for Survey Monkey with additional costs in terms of staff time.

Cllr Piazza commented that members of the public that are not computer literate haven't been able to attend online meetings, please can this be addressed. The Mayor answered that meetings may be moved back to TTC when guidance allows. Cllr Beaver mentioned that there is a system whereby public could submit questions/statements to be addressed by Town Clerk prior to the meeting.

3383 **POLICE MATTERS**

A Police Report was received from Sergeant Leighton Williams.

- Demand is on the increase now Covid restrictions have been lifted; Covid patrols (rule of 6), education and encouragements will be used before enforcement. Adult Safeguarding team will address concerns around domestic abuse victims who are isolating. For coming weeks it will be schools which will be patrolled at the beginning and end of the day regarding social distancing. Hopefully working on school premises will be possible in time. Engaging with communities at community events will be considered depending on Covid.
- Speed Enforcement is also being tackled, with work being highlighted on social media. Cllr King highlighted that her area is still waiting for a SID.
- It was stated that the drugs teams and targeting teams are tackling County Lines as a collective team. One individual who has been dealing drugs from her property has been dealt with. It was asked whether the drug use in Biss Meadows is known about as it seems drug taking has become more prolific. The local PCOs have done their best to tackle this but it remains a priority. Cannabis is a controlled Class B substance which is dealt with if laws are broken, particularly dealers and for those disregarding the rules.
- A local resident of Cockhill asked if the work could be increased on speeding prevention. Also it was noticed that there were people smoking cocaine in the multi storey stair well. The Sergeant stated that our presence is at the multi storey as much as possible and we will look at the report.
- Cllr Piazza asked about Elmgrove gangs meeting armed with golf clubs, knives and drugs, reassurance is needed for the residents. Sergeant responded that Elmgrove is briefed at every tasking meeting and the officers will patrol regularly. If it becomes a long term problem, we will allocate officers to tackle it.
- Cllr Oldrieve asked about e-scooters. Sergeant Williams answered they are illegal to use on the road or pavements but in the first instance it would be education and it is known that some regulation is required.

3384 **QUESTION 2008232152 LETTER TO RESIDENTS OF NORTH BRADLEY**

A question submitted by Cllr Kirk was considered and answered:

Question:

Please can the Town Clerk advise the reasoning and purpose behind changing the actual figures I provided in demonstrating the difference between the Trowbridge and North Bradley Council Precepts to an overall percentage which includes the non-variable Wiltshire Council figure of £1515.00?

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Town Clerk's Response:

To ensure that the residents were not provided with misleading information, as residents typically think of Council Tax in terms of the amount they have to pay each month or as per the bill they receive from Wiltshire Council and do not think in terms of the amounts charged by each authority which make up the total bill.

Cllr Kirk stated he disagreed with the Town Clerk's answer as he feels it is misleading. He believes his original motion was correct. The Mayor highlighted the Town Clerk issued a letter to residents in accordance with the resolution agreed at Full Council.

3385 QUESTION 2008240806 COMMUNITY GOVERNANCE REVIEW

A question submitted by Cllr Kirk was considered and answered;

Question:

For full disclosure of the facts, please can the Town Clerk now provide each resident of North Bradley affected by the boundary change a copy of the Town Council's submission to the Community Governance Review in relation to North Bradley, which explains that it was Trowbridge Town Council who proposed these changes, which will lead to an increase in their Council Tax?

Town Clerk's Response:

Cllr Kirk is not correct. The boundary proposed has never been promoted by or proposed by Trowbridge Town Council. Trowbridge Town Council always opposed the proposed boundary until the final consultation, when to all intents and purposes the matter is finalised, at which point the Town Council reluctantly accepted the change. Trowbridge Town Council did propose an alternative which would have excluded the area between White Horse Business Park and North Bradley village but included the areas within and around the Ashton Park site and the Elm Grove/Drynham Lane site. The proposal which is currently due to be considered by Wiltshire Council was proposed by Wiltshire Council.

Cllr Kirk is happy to accept the Town Clerk's response to this question.

3386 QUESTION 2009032032 UNREASONABLE BEHAVIOUR POLICY

A question submitted by Cllr Kirk was considered and answered;

Statement:

In response to a question from Cllr Hoar about a third party appeal process to the unreasonable behaviour policy, the Town Clerk stated that: "the Information Commissioners Officer (ICO) would be the final body that would rule of the implementation of this policy and whether it was considered reasonable or not to have done so (SIC to have implemented a contact restriction against a person or not)". However, the ICO have stated on the record that: 'The ICO does not have the remit to consider complaints about decisions to apply an unreasonable behaviour policy such as the one approved by Trowbridge Town Council. There may also be personal data issues that the ICO would consider.' Therefore, this renders our newly implemented unreasonable behaviour policy void (as a section of the policy is unworkable and open to legal challenge), because we will be acting as judge, jury and executioner, and therefore members of the public will not receive the right to an independent hearing.

Question:

Please can this therefore be referred back to Policy & Resources?

Town Clerk's Response:

Ultimately if a member of the public is not happy with the way in which the Town Council has or has not responded or not to a request for information then the ICO does have the remit to rule. Such an issue could arise from the council's implementation of the policy and therefore in that sense there

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is a back stop opportunity for members of the public unhappy with such matters, although this is not specifically the ICO ruling on the application of the policy.

Through his use of the word 'executioner' Cllr Kirk implies that the council has the opportunity to punish a member of the public, this is not the case and Cllr Kirk should apologise for such an inflammatory statement.

Cllr Kirk implies that there are other matters relating to the way in which the council implements policy which are subject to a third party independent hearing. This is not the case, the town council is not covered by the Ombudsman and in such matters all parish and town councillors act within the legal framework in adopting policy, implementing that policy and reaching conclusions on the correct implementation of that policy through any appeals process. To imply this is disruptive, confusing and lacking in understanding and judgement on the part of Cllr Kirk.

Cllr Kirk stated that he was just clarifying his statement during a public meeting. The Mayor suggested this issue is taken up with the Town Clerk.

3387 **QUESTION: 2009032247 DORIC PARK**

A question submitted by Cllr Kirk was considered and answered;

Doric Park. Question:

- a) Please can all Councillors be circulated a revised financial spreadsheet detailing the income stream which will be contractually in place prior to the development commencement (both for contract terms and usage)?
- b) Please can Councillors be supplied with the details of discussions with the various potential interested parties, whether this is formally point scored or just meeting notes?
- c) Please can the Town Council investigate the cost of having the project plan reviewed by an independent business plan consultant?

Town Clerk's Response

Cllr Kirk is confusing councillors and the public by referring to the location of the proposed development as being in the Parish of Hilperton, this is irrelevant.

Cllr Kirk has failed to explain that the repayments are dependent upon the rate of interest which applies to the loan when the loan is taken out and they may be higher or lower than the figure he has quoted.

Councillor Kirk is acting irresponsibly and disruptively in suggesting that councillors have only been provided with the forecast financial spreadsheet. They, as well as the public, have been provided with an extensive report detailing all aspects of the project which together with the forecast financial spreadsheet forms the Business Plan at this stage.

Cllr Kirk is wrong to suggest that the forecast financial spreadsheet is based primarily on assumptions. It is not based on assumptions, it is based on:

- Extensive negotiations, research and background checks on existing facilities.
- Known pricing and demand for other similar facilities.
- Adopted policy of Wiltshire Council.
- Extensive negotiations with Wiltshire Council over many years, resulting in the transfer of over £600,000 of Section 106 funding for the project.
- A grant of over £480,000 from the Football Foundation, following many years of discussions with the Wiltshire Football Association and the presentation of an extensive report and business plan as part of the grant application process.
- Extensive discussions and negotiations over a number of years with Wiltshire College, backed up by a formal Memorandum of Understanding signed by the College Principal and the Town Clerk.
- A long term relationship with and commitment from Trowbridge Town Football Club.
- A long term relationship with and commitment from Trowbridge Wanderers Football Club.
- Extensive negotiations with Trowbridge Rugby Union Football Club.
- The support of Sport England.
- The support of the Rugby Football Union.

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- The support of the Wiltshire & Swindon Sports Partnership.
- Discussions with and commitments from Staverton Rangers Football Club.
- Discussions with and commitments from Bath Rugby Club.

The full updated business plan and updated forecast financial spreadsheet will be presented to the council prior to them considering whether to seek borrowing approval and to proceed with the project.

Cllr Kirk understands that this is going to be looked at independently but he was not given adequate information at the time.

3388 MOTION 2007100852 PUBLICATION OF PANEL/BOARD MINUTES

RESOLVED to note that;

This motion refers to an issue which was considered by and subject of a resolution at the Full Council Meeting on 21st July 2020 and therefore in accordance with Standing Order A13 it would not be appropriate for the Council to reconsider this matter before 21st January 2021 without the support of at least seven members of the council.

3389 MOTION 2007100953: LETTER TO RESIDENTS OF NORTH BRADLEY

Withdrawn by Cllr Kirk.

3390 MOTION 2007101133 CONSULTATION

To consider the following MOTION proposed by Cllr Kirk and seconded by Cllr Cooper.

MOTION:

That as a Council we accept the mentioning the Park Storage Unit (or any other project requiring borrowing) in an edition of the Town Council Magazine, whilst apparently permissible in terms of the loan application, does not constitute consultation with residents in any meaningful way. Therefore, Policy & Resources should consider stipulating additional means of resident consultation with any future borrowing.

Cllr Kirk stated that it was intimated the ministry wouldn't give approval. They don't check the consultation thoroughly. The magazine tells the public what we are doing in terms of storage costs, it doesn't conduct consultation. Members must accept with Doric Park it was inadequate to put a statement in the parish magazine, stating this was consultation for borrowing. We need to improve our process for consultation. H.Bell will conduct the consultation for Doric Park publicly once the rugby club members have voted.

A recorded vote was taken, results are in the appendices.

The motion was **CARRIED**.

Town Clerk's Response:

Each time that Trowbridge Town Council has submitted a borrowing approval application to be considered by the Ministry we have complied in full with the guidance published by the Ministry and have undertaken extensive discussions with the officers at the Ministry to ensure that the Council has met the requirements, including consultation. If the Council had not met the requirements, then the Ministry would not have allowed the borrowing approval.

RECOMMENDATION: That the Council notes that the Council has always met the consultation requirements of the Ministry when completing a borrowing approval application and that it will continue to do so, and that this will vary dependent upon the amount of the proposed borrowing, the impact of the borrowing on the Council Tax Charge and the financial risk associated with the project and therefore fully understands

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that consultation for a £2.2 million loan for the Sport Pitches Project will require a greater level of consultation than that undertaken for the Park Storage Unit Project.

A recorded vote was taken, results are in the appendices.
The recommendation was **RESOLVED**.

3391 **MOTION 2007102240 POLICY**

The Council considered a MOTION proposed by Cllr Piazza and seconded by Cllr Bazan.

RESOLVED: That this council:

- **Commits to upholding the highest standards of public office**
- **Encourages all Members, officers and residents alike to avoid unkind, rude and personal attacks and comments against anyone**
- **Given recent global events, recognises the Office for Democratic Institutions and Human Rights statement on racism and xenophobia:**
“Prejudice or hostility towards a person’s race, colour, language, nationality, or national or ethnic origin. Whilst some communities are particularly vulnerable, any ethnic group can be the target of racism. Intolerant discourse in the media or from politicians can lead to increased racist sentiments towards migrants and other minorities, including in the form of scapegoating.”
- **Promotes anti-racism in Trowbridge: including beliefs, actions, and policies adopted or developed to oppose racism.**

A recorded vote was taken, results of which are included in the appendices.

3392 **MOTION 2007102241 TOILETS**

Cllr Piazza stated this has been a controversial topic and it is time to draw a line under it. The decision made was ill-informed. The Mayor stated that the decision took a long time to make and the motion to demolish the toilets was carried and he doesn’t accept that an error was made. He believes the decision made was the correct one. Cllr Cavill agreed that at the time it was the right decision to make and it is time to move on. Cllr Kirk stated that his knowledge was far greater in terms of the toilet situation in other towns but agrees that based on the reports at the time he might have made the same decision. Cllr Cavill stated that as a result we are looking into things in much more detail. Cllr Palmen accepted the decision at the time and believes sufficient information was available at the time. Cllr Piazza stated that vulnerable groups in our community need to be considered, as in the case with the community garden, and that is who he wants to represent.

MOTION:

That Trowbridge Town Council accepts it made an error in judgement on the demolition of our park toilets and apologises to those most vulnerable in the community for making an uninformed decision, not backed up by evidence, and its statements up to this point in time.

Town Clerk’s Response.

When the town council made the decision to close the toilets it followed an extensive period of closure and consideration of options. It would therefore be considered incorrect to suggest that it was an uninformed decision. The evidence considered by the Council was extensive, including consideration of alternative facilities which were available and reports on social media of the use and or lack of use of the closed facilities. It would therefore be considered incorrect to suggest that the decision was not backed up by evidence. The Town Council is not required to retain copies of social media posts and therefore the fact that the town council responded to a Freedom Of Information request that it does not hold that information, cannot result in a conclusion that the evidence did not exist and was not considered by the council at the time that it took the decision.

A recorded vote was taken, results of which are included in the appendices.

The motion was LOST.

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3393 MOTION: 2008271031 ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR IN THE TOWN PARK

The Council considered a motion proposed by Councillor Bryant, seconded by Cllr Oldrieve.

MOTION:

That Neighbourhood Services Committee considers the benefit of employing a member of staff to monitor, on a regular basis, activities within Trowbridge Town Park, and possibly a wider locale, with the ability to officiate over antisocial behaviour with the power to administer on-the-spot fines, where deemed legal under bye-law legislation.

RESOLVED to REFER the MOTION to Neighbourhood Services Committee.

3394 MOTION: 2008271031 PROVISION OF FREE PARKING BY WILTSHIRE COUNCIL

Cllr Bryant stated the public are owed clarity regarding free parking, although we are at the will of Wiltshire Council and we are aware of the covenant. If anything happens to the multi-storey, we need to see a commitment to parking from Wiltshire Council. Cllr Hill asked if free parking could be made available in half the car park to prevent county staff taking all the free spaces. Cllr Kirk stated that any free parking from Wiltshire Council will not happen, already clarified by Cllr Whitehead. We must not deceive the public and have to accept this. Cllr Piazza agreed there is no chance that Wiltshire Council will preserve these 475 spaces. He noted that there is no form of covenant on the spaces, is it possible to add this? Cllr Brice stated a covenant is for the land owner, not the public. Cllr Kirk stated it would need to be a contractual agreement. There was no seconder for an amendment to the motion.

RESOLVED:

That Trowbridge Town Council writes to Wiltshire Council to seek assurance that, whatever the outcome of the Future High Streets Fund, there will be a commitment to preserving 475 free (at point of use) parking spaces allocated within the vicinity of the town centre.

3395 MOTION 2009011108 THERMAL TREATMENT PLANT

Cllr Bazan supports Ms Hillcoat's statement in the public open forum. Cllr Cavill stated things have moved on since waste was incinerated. He would prefer it not to be here but some reasons are misunderstandings and will abstain from this vote. The Mayor has every sympathy for residents of Westbury and he understands the concerns they have. The traffic will become a problem and many of these facilities are next door to a dairy therefore he will support the motion. Cllr Kirk highlighted that Westbury should be the last place to be considered due to congestion and poor transport links.

RESOLVED:

That the town council, having recently declared a climate emergency, recognises the concerns of residents in the town and surrounding villages and makes their opposition known to the changes to the potential development of the thermal treatment plant in Westbury, specifically stating their concerns around traffic, pollution levels and effects on the residents of the town. Details of the preamble were provided by the residents of Westbury.

A recorded vote was taken, results of which are in the appendices.

3396 MOTION 2009011312 WESSEX WATER REFILL POINT

Cllr Hill gave an update that he took this to the environmental group. When he asked for a water refill station he was told we have one but discovered that this station is in the atrium of Wiltshire Council. It was suggested that the developers of Innox Mill could have paid for a station to be installed there but this is too late now. Cllr Brice stated that we used to have one in the park but suggests that the cost of connection might be the problem. Cllr Hill advised that it's quite complicated in terms of maintenance, testing and choice between chilled and ambient temperature. The Mayor suggested this should go through the Neighbourhood Services Committee.

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MOTION:

That Trowbridge Town Council applies for a Wessex Water refill point.

RECOMMENDATION:

That Trowbridge Town Council notes that it is already progressing the provision of a Wessex Water refill point.

RESOLVED to REFER the matter to Neighbourhood Services Committee.

3397 MOTION: 2009011312 COMPLIANCE WITH ACCOUNTS & AUDIT REGULATIONS

The Council considered a motion proposed by Cllrs Piazza, seconded by Cllr Kirk.

RESOLVED:

That Trowbridge Town Council follows UK legislation and makes it immediate priority to put all relevant documents, as stated in the preamble, in the public domain (such as our website) and complies with all parts of Regulations 13 of the Accounts and Audit Regulations 2015.

A recorded vote was taken, results of which are included in the appendices.

3398 MOTION: 2009022203 STANDING ORDERS

Cllr Kirk stated that the Town Clerk has accepted motions on a lesser time scale but he is happy for this to be delegated to P&R.

MOTION:

That the Town Council accept that my Motions were submitted in accordance with the precise wording of Standing Order A9.1 and that if the Council requires a different period of notice, this is discussed at the next meeting of Policy & Resources.

Town Clerk's Response.

The Town Clerk has no record of receiving such a request on 14th July 2020.

Cllr Kirk is not correct to suggest that this matter has been totally ignored. It has been discussed with the Mayor and the Leader and will be presented to the next meeting of the Policy & resources committee as one of a number of proposed changes to Standing Orders.

Cllr Kirk is once again acting disruptively and irresponsibly to suggest that there is a link between Standing Orders and the Unreasonable Behaviour Policy.

The previous motions were rejected in accordance with Standing Orders:

A9.5 The decision of the Proper Officer as to whether or not to include the motion in the agenda shall be final.

Cllr Kirk is yet again acting disruptively and irresponsibly to suggest that he or any other person has to second guess the Town Clerk. The Town Clerk is available to provide advice in advance of a motion being submitted.

RESOLVED to REFER to P&R Committee.

3399 MOTION: 2009022339 ACTIVE TROWBRIDGE COSTS

The Council considered the following MOTION proposed by Cllr Kirk, seconded by Cllr Cooper.

MOTION:

That Active Trowbridge ensure that the direct cost of providing services in neighbouring Parish Schools (tier 2) are fully covered, by either the School or the respective Parish Council.

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Town Clerk's Response

Cllr Kirk is correct to suggest that there are some schools in neighbouring parishes which receive a subsidised service from Active Trowbridge and this is to cover those pupils who are residents of Trowbridge. Of the schools which do not have any pupils who are resident of Trowbridge, none of them receive a subsidy and Cllr Kirk's understanding is incorrect. In relation to the direct costs of providing staff and travelling to the schools then all schools, including schools in the town (tier 1) and those in neighbouring parishes (tier 2) cover such direct costs and all subsidy is to cover indirect costs only.

RESOLVED to REFER to Leisure & Information Services Committee.

3400 **MOTION: 2009032125 ON-STREET PARKING**

Cllr Kirk is concerned about the cycle scheme but it could be used as a means of getting free parking adjacent to Lovemead Car Park. Cllr Cavill has an issue with bollards which are an accident waiting to happen as the lanes are too narrow. Cllr Palmen stated that talking this through with CATG will have more impact. Cllr Bazan and Cllr Kirk clarified that this has poorly thought through and an accident has already happened which has been submitted to Wiltshire Council. The scheme was not fully implemented, there will be a sign and the bollard will be moved back with an independent assessment.

RESOLVED:

That the Town Council confirms it wishes to retain on-street parking in suitable locations at the existing level.

A Recorded Vote was taken, results of which are in the appendices.

3401 **POLICY**

Cllr Oldrieve reported on the latest Environment Policy, accepting this may need to be adapted in the future. Cllr Palmen stated that this working party demonstrates that we can successfully work with communities to develop policies. Cllr Piazza requested that the policy should be updated every 12 months minimum. J. Weimar clarified that the policy is reviewed 4 yearly. Cllr Oldrieve requested that this will be updated in 1 year, after change of council. J. Weimar updated the policy to be reviewed in September 2021. Most policies are reviewed 4 yearly, or as and when needed.

The updated Environment Policy was CARRIED and APPROVED for adoption.
